





Inspired by a student request during Seabury Hall's student assembly,

Lauralei Singsank, a senior, donated a brand new computer tablet for a teen boy receiving hospice care with Hospice Maui. My first patient as a hospice volunteer was admitted to Hospice Maui in summer 2015. I stayed with her for 7 months. She had just gotten out of the hospital. She was hooked up to oxygen 24/7 and had a life-limiting disease, but she maintained a near-independent lifestyle, in which she lived on her own, cooked and generally took care of herself. She requested a volunteer to take her grocery shopping once a week. These shopping trips were the beginning of our acquaintance. I soon realized that she sought companionship more than orange juice and ice cream. We became friends, despite our 60-year age difference and the fact that she was seven months out from the end of her life. We looked forward to our time together to talk, listen and laugh. About a month before she passed, my mom came to visit me from the mainland. When I shared the news with the patient she lit up and said, "Oh, won't you please bring her to see me? I'd love to meet her!" Even at this stage in her life she was still interested in meeting new people, especially someone so important to me.

We all grieve differently. Our bereavement program includes weekly support groups, a monthly newsletter, an annual Memorial Day service, and our annual Holiday Open House.
