By the time you read this, our 5-bedroom Hale will have been serving this community for almost one year. So far, we have served more than 50 patients and their families. The core, the heart of that service has been the abundance of loving care that our dedicated Hale staff have given to each and every patient. While this is the very same deeply touching care that our exceptional staff of RN’s, hospice aides, social workers, doctors, spiritual counselors, and volunteers have provided in home and community settings for decades, our Hale is a setting

where this care can be seen and experienced in action, and so it provides a more visible testament to the way that Hospice Maui has always served this community.

The Hale has one RN and one hospice aide working there at all times, around the clock, plus a full-time manager who is also an RN. Each of the 13 Hale staff members felt called to do this work, to be a part of this very special team. They have been eager to learn how we do hospice care, and have each given their hearts to this work. Their more “visible” work in fact draws attention and appreciation to the rest of our clinical staff who continue to work quietly in homes or in

other institutional settings to enrich the lives of so many.

In celebrating the success of Hospice Maui Hale and the wonderful ways that our Hale staff serve those who spend their final days here, we are also celebrating our 35 years of providing hospice service to thousands upon thousands of people living on this special island. And the word “celebrate” is fitting because in our work with people whose lives are nearing completion, our staff assists them and their family members to quietly celebrate the lives of all those they love, regardless of where they are in the trajectory of their lives.

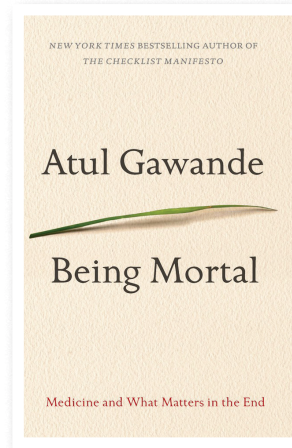
