Aloha Everyone,

Our hearts are with all who have been dealing with the devastating losses from the August fires. The new reality we all now share continues to affect us as we care for our patients and families and each other with extra love, patience and compassion.

On August 8th our team responded to initial reports of the fires, enacting our emergency operations plan to make sure all our patients and staff were safe or able to evacuate. In the immediate aftermath, we assembled a mobile outreach team of nurses, social workers and certified nursing assistants to provide outreach and support to shelters and impacted communities.

Donations from all over and monies from our Kokua Fund helped us supply food and water; medications; medical supplies; durable medical equipment; and anything else we could offer or do to help our community in the relief efforts. We continue to provide counseling and grief support with our professional staff via support groups and educational workshops.

On November 4th, I was on Moloka'i for their Annual Floating Lantern Ceremony event, honoring and remembering loved ones. Among the lanterns released, we offered a "MauiStrong" lantern to represent the love & strength in our communities as we try to heal and bring hope to everyone impacted by the fires.

We are grateful for your continued monetary and in-kind donations that support our work in the community offering the most compassionate and professional hospice & palliative care.

May the spirit of aloha continue to sustain our resilience and serve as a guide on our path to recovery and healing. Even during the most challenging times we are not alone and we are stronger together.

In honor and memory of **Charlotte Flavin** Hospice Maui Volunteer

Charlotte was born in Puunene in 1936 and was a graduate of St. Anthony High School. She truly dedicated her entire life to helping others. She was a nurse, a nun, a teacher, a hospice volunteer for over 40 years, and along with her late husband, Dan, created the non-profit “Somos Ohana” to help provide basic needs for children and families in Nicaragua.

No one remembers exactly how long Charlotte was a volunteer with Hospice Maui, not even Charlotte. I don’t know how many patients she helped comfort and ease through their dying process - providing care or spiritual support, her gentle presence. I couldn’t count how many friends and family members she supported along the way. When you met Charlotte, people could feel that she had such a depth and peace to her, and I found myself quieting as we spent any time together. To me, she always represented the best of what Maui and Hospice Maui is.

When her time came, we were fortunate to care for her as she had done for so many, and she stayed with us in the Hale for her last weeks. During that time, we had recently started offering Hospice services on Molokai, and I asked her if she had any advice. “Listen”, she said, “and respect what people are already doing.” Mahalo Charlotte. We will keep listening, and keep respecting.

Introducing Dr. Jackson Wyers

Hospice Maui is excited to share that as of August 1st, we welcomed Dr. Jackson Wyers to our team! “I was excited about the opportunity to advance palliative care and to help fill a void in the community as I have seen how other communities have benefited so much from it.” Dr. Jackson, as he likes to be called, is now our primary provider of medical support for our new Palliative Care program. Initially offered in partnership with Maui Memorial Medical Center, we are now able to offer palliative care support to patients in the community as well.

Like our Hospice Care, our Palliative Care program focuses on relieving discomfort, improving symptom management, and offering emotional support, ensuring that patients and families can maintain dignity and enjoy life to the fullest. The two primary differences between hospice and palliative care are that palliative care allows patients to continue to seek curative treatment for the qualifying diagnosis and does not require patients to have a 6 month limited life expectancy.

Hospice Maui is here to help and support you or a loved one no matter what stage you are in. Not all insurance plans cover this service at this time, so please call to talk with our caring staff at 808-244-5555 or email info@hospicemaui.org.

Dr. Wyers is a fellowship trained hospice and palliative medicine physician. He received his doctorate in medicine from Texas Tech University and completed his residency in Emergency Medicine from the University of Arizona. Dr. Wyers then received his fellowship in Hospice and Palliative Care from Baylor Scott & White Health in Temple, Texas.
