

Palliative Care Program &

Hospice Maui partnered with Maui Memorial Medical Center in January 2023 to be its provider of palliative care. Hospice Maui's medical director, Dr. Chad Farmer, visits hospitalized patients with chronic and advanced conditions to help improve the quality of life for people living with serious illness.

Our care team delivers compassionate, personalized care for the whole person from managing symptoms and side effects from treatments to pain, anxiety, breathing difficulties, nausea, and more.


