In memory of our mom,
Lola Gebauer
JULY 4, 1921 – MARCH 2, 2020

I feel lucky to have been part of the hospice movement, it has changed my life. Recalling the founding days back to 1977 when a few of us gathered at the Cameron Center with the intent of starting hospice care on Maui, to then being employed by Hospice Maui as a Patient Care Coordinator and finally working as a volunteer to facilitate the staff until 2004.

You can imagine my feelings of gratitude, comfort, and confidence when it came time to call upon Hospice Maui for services for our dear mom.

What a gift Hospice Maui's care was to our family when my mother, Lola, a strong willed redheaded firecracker, born on July 4, 1921, was now dying. Lola was resistant to calling but I had to insist, as hospice care was essential in being able to keep mom comfortable at home. Of course, the feelings

of grief, loss and anguish were present. However, with Hospice Maui, I witnessed a level of professional medical care and emotional support that instilled in my family a sense of relief and confidence knowing that Lola had the BEST. Even though it was only two weeks, the time was precious, brimming and challenging.

Most significantly, I felt that the spirit of the original mission of Hospice Maui, was still very much intact. The energy and care were compassionate, informed, proactive, calm, efficient, accessible, thorough and friendly. All staff members were so present and skilled dealing with the family AND our 'willful' Puna. The "feeling connections" established in the caring for a fading loved one are still at the heart of Hospice Maui.

Compared to what we had to offer in the early 80s, Hospice Maui has evolved into a veritable candy store of health professionals (Doctors, RNs, LSWs, spiritual counselors, grief counselors, aids, volunteers and their hearts), along with a wide range of therapy services and equipment. I was there back then and am here today, such a gift, a treasure really. Hospice Maui continues to impact my life again and again. Thank you.

Aloha everyone,

An important part of Hospice Maui's work is bringing 'Ohana together when a loved one is approaching their time to leave this earthly existence. Yet, in these times of COVID-19, this "bringing together" also increases the risk of infection. Our work often brings us into contact with frail elderly patients and family members, and so minimizing the risk is very important. Doing so in the home and nursing home settings is challenging enough, but it poses a particularly difficult dilemma in our Hospice Maui Hale.

Our 5-bedroom Hale provides a very important service to the Maui community: in 2019 we admitted 141 patients! In order to continue to provide this service safely in these times of COVID, we have needed to adopt much more restrictive policies: We allow fewer visitors in the bedrooms at any one time and we don't allow visitors in the common spaces. But on the other hand, we are encouraging the use of the "sand lot" space outside each bedroom by family members, and we are starting to raise funds to greatly improve that space.

Please take a look at our wish list and see that we have already posted a preliminary figure there which we anticipate will underwrite the cost of upgrading the area outside each room. Hospice Maui is only able to creatively respond to changing needs like this through the support of our generous community, and for that we are very grateful!
